## Ashes to What?

A typical human cremation yields an amount of ash that's equivalent to a five-pound bag of sugar. Most people just keep the ashes in an urn or scatter them, but apparently it's possible to turn at least some of those ashes into a stunning work of art for all posterity to see.

I just read about a company called "Eternal Arts" that ran its business by turning two cups of a person's cremains into a classic sculpture. Imagine your ashes reshaped into a replica of Rodin's *The Thinker*, or one of Michelangelo's creations. Perhaps your tastes run in the more popular realm and you'd like to become the Statue of Liberty, or a bust of Napoleon or Alexander the Great.

On this Ash Wednesday, the first day of the season of Lent, we ponder the permanence of ash. It means something has burned. It is gone. Beyond recognition or recovery. Not just singed or charred, but burned.

At the end of his ordeal with God where he tried to tell God what to do, and then realized it was a bad idea, Job is quoted in the Bible as saying, "I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes" (Job 42:6).

What is burned? Well, the better question is, "who is burned?" Job himself! Or, actually, Job the person who rebelled against God and accused God and doubted God and wouldn't trust God. That particular Job was burned, not singed or charred, but burned. Gone for good. Replaced by a new Job who wanted to live God's way, trusted in God, and felt relieved in God's forgiveness and love.

Want to be a better person tomorrow than today? Then on Ash Wednesday take time to repent

like Job. Leave the old you behind in dust and ashes, beyond recognition. Forgiven by the love of God in Christ, begin a new day as a new person. Cremate your sinful self! And for heaven's sake don't try to make something out of it that it is not!

PRAYER: Most holy and merciful Father, we confess to you and to one another that we have sinned by our own fault, by our own grievous fault, in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart and mind and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

We have been deaf to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ.

We have grieved the Holy Spirit.

Forgive us, Lord, for the wrongs we have done. For our blindness to human need and suffering and our indifference to injustice and cruelty. For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward others, and for

our prejudice and contempt for those who differ from us. For what we think or say or do that is at variance with your will. Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us. Hear us, Lord, for your mercy is great. Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation, that we may show forth your glory in the world. By the cross and suffering of your Son, O Lord, bring us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection. Amen.

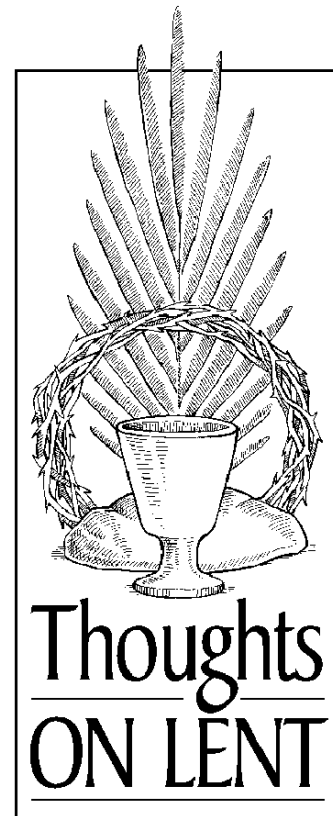

## Monday Night Services

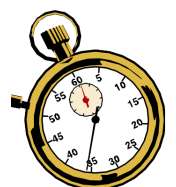

### SCHOOL NEWS

- Enrollment is currently 648 – it was 614 at this time last year. Currently 154 eighth graders have indicated they plan on attending FVL next year.
- Applications for the 2019-20 *Wisconsin Parental Choice Program* are open until April 20. Families should check FVL's website to see if they would qualify for this state program that helps families to fully-fund tuition for their teens. For those who might not qualify, but still need financial assistance, FVL's Tuition Assistance application process is also open the same dates this year.

- In early February, Leadership Week was organized by our *Peer Leadership Group* to strengthen student leadership skills and to create stronger bonds among our student body. FVL juniors volunteered an afternoon at their home churches or schools.

### COCURRICULARS

- The Forensics team is enjoying early season success. Next up are Sub-district and District competitions.
- Our chapter of *Future Business Leaders of America* qualified 16 students for State competition. The team finished fourth in regional competition

against 28 other high schools with 650 students competing.

- FVL Theatre will offer public performances of its spring musical *Crazy for You* on March 8-10. Tickets are available online or at the door.
- National Honors Society is sponsoring a 5K fun run in April to support Children's Hospital. Register at [runforlives2019.com](http://runforlives2019.com).

### FINANCIAL UPDATE

- Congregation support for operations is 3.8% (or, about \$20K) ahead of what had been collected at this time last year. We are about \$59K short of budget at this time.
- *Let the Children Come* gifts totaled \$6,600 in January, bringing the total given toward the first principal and interest payments to \$97K. A total of \$475K needs to be raised by November annually to meet the loan payments.
- Gifts to the FVL Foundation are always appreciated. The Foundation supports FVL through tuition assistance and professional development. An annual goal of \$300K has been set to grow the Foundation and stabilize the operations and outreach of the high school.
- With support from our *Partnering with Business* sponsors, Musicfest in late January raised over \$9K for the FVL Fine Arts program and the *Let the Children Come* effort.

## Building Project Update

As of this writing, we just received our updated proposal from our design-build contractor, Keller. Much depended on our receipt of the new proposal and we will review it at our next Building Committee meeting, in the meantime other preparatory work continues. The preliminary schedule is as follows: shortly after we've celebrated our risen Savior at Easter on April 21, Keller plans to break ground. First steps include some utility relocation/extensions, foundation work, and demolition work. Builders for Christ plans to mobilize the first week in June. Our goal is completion by September 1, 2019. We expect to have a more detailed schedule from Keller a couple of weeks after acceptance of their new proposal. The new schedule will be shared with members so they can plan ahead for volunteer work and availability of the church building for other uses. We anticipate worshipping next door, at Oak Park Place, while the sanctuary expansion and remodel is underway.

Our site civil engineer, Schuler, has obtained site plan approval and the erosion control permit from the City of Appleton. They also expect to obtain the City stormwater permit within the next week. Additionally, Schuler has submitted the wetland exemption request from DNR for our proposed wetland fill.

Coordination with Builders for Christ is ongoing. This week, the City is expected to issue the Temporary Use Permit for 10 BFC RV's to camp on our parking lot during their stay. Other coordination includes meals, housing for members with no RV's, insurance, and the like. Our BFC Project Manager, Paul LeBrun, is expecting to stop in to meet with Keller and the Building Committee on April 24 or 25.

New volunteer questionnaires are located on the entryway sign up table, to help us recruit and schedule volunteers for such work as the AV/Sound system, painting and staining, assisting with electrical work, landscaping, providing meals and housing for Builders for Christ, assisting BFC with rough and finish carpentry, and providing offsite storage of church items and equipment during construction. Please fill out a form if you didn't fill one out last May, or if your situation has changed since then, or if you would like to help with the two new items that were not on the old form (Housing and Storage).

We thank God for blessing our planning efforts thus far. May God continue to bless our efforts as we strive to serve him with our time, talents, and treasures. What an exciting time for our congregation!

## Land Purchase Progress

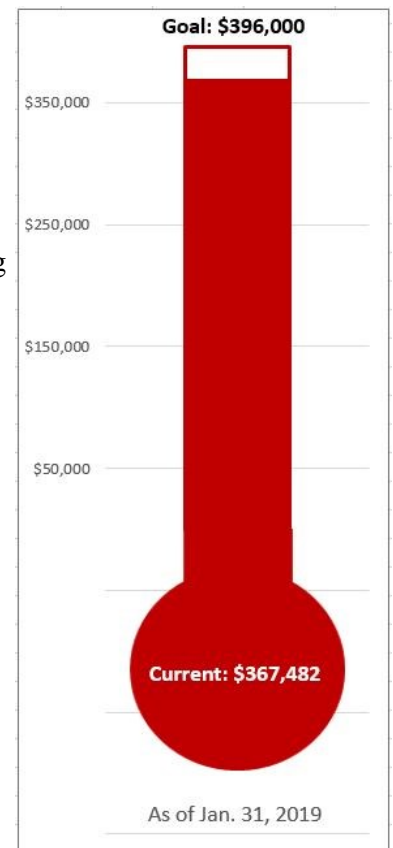

## Meal for a Mission

The new meal for a mission project is Vulnerable Children's Foundation (<http://www.vulnerablechildren.net>). The goal for this meal for a mission is \$2,500.

These two schools have taught over 300 students each -- these are all students who have lost either one or both parents to disease or famine. Many get their only meal of the day at the school and have to scavenge through the garbage dumps for the necessities of life. Often these youngsters have only one set of clothes and shoes.

To make things worse, the meals offered on both campuses have had to be curtailed because of funding and legal issues with the government there. The VCF board is trying to find ways to help get the meal program at both schools restarted. Last year FVL sent a small mission team to the schools. They stayed at our seminary in Lusaka since this group is in fellowship with our Synod.

Our dollars can make a huge difference in these schools for these young Christian lives. While we are used to church/separation issues in our American schools, these schools in Lusaka can openly share Jesus with their students on a daily basis. Another big plus is that our dollars can do so much there. I have been told the entire budget for these schools is \$10,000 annually.

## Book Club

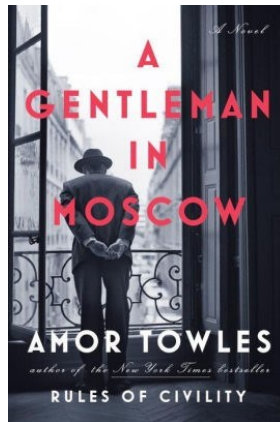

Rostov, an indomitable man of erudition and wit, has never worked a day in his life, and must now live in an attic room while some of the most tumultuous decades in Russian history are unfolding outside the hotel's doors. Unexpectedly, his reduced circumstances provide him a doorway into a much larger world of emotional discovery.

The Hope Center is an outreach ministry of WELS United located on the campus of St Matthew Lutheran Church in downtown Appleton, WI. The center is a non-profit, volunteer agency that is financially supported by members of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod. We provide a loving and supportive place for those in need in our community to be enriched physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

### In 2018:

- ♦ The Hope Center welcomed 86 family units (up from 67 in 2017)--a total of 106 adults and 152 children
- ♦ Each month, we assisted an average of 102 individuals (32 families) by providing hygiene items and cleaning supplies
- ♦ Continued partnership with the Fox Cities Diaper Bank to distribute diapers and feminine hygiene products
- ♦ Offered spiritual counseling, information on baptism, and made efforts to share the gospel whenever possible
- ♦ Nearly 800 volunteer hours
- ♦ Donations of \$21K, including practical assistance items
- ♦ Average monthly expenses of \$800-900
- ♦ Hosted a Thanksgiving event and provided Thanksgiving meal basket to 34 families
- ♦ Coordinated four Christmas adopt-a-family opportunities supported by local congregations/members
- ♦ Supported the Pillars Resource Center through coffee donations and provided a Christmas party lunch
