ABOUT OUR SERIES: IMMINENT ARRIVAL

The feeling when someone important is about to arrive at your place: a mixture of excitement and nervousness. *Did you make all the correct preparations? Will the person be happy to see you? When and how will the person arrive? Will there be any surprises?*During these weeks before Christmas, we anticipate the imminent arrival of Jesus. He's an important person! We are about to celebrate his birth. He could return on judgment day at any time. And we realize that he is present with us already in his Word and sacraments. Nervousness gives way to excitement because of his imminent arrival.

ABOUT TODAY'S SERVICE: IMMINENT ARRIVAL OF THE KING

The arrival of the King is a big deal. Advent ("arrival" or "coming") marks the start of a new Church Year. We begin at the end, watching King Jesus ride into Jerusalem on a donkey colt, knowing full well that he will be killed before the end of the week. The events of Palm Sunday serve as a microcosm for all Jesus' work, proving the King of the universe was willing to humble himself and endure anything for our salvation. That is precisely why Christ came. That is why we anticipate his imminent arrival not with worry but with joy.

The chapel lights remain dimmed until the lighting of the advent wreath.



CHILDREN'S MESSAGE and LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH

We light one Advent candle, remembering Jesus, who is coming again. He will come to gather his people from everywhere, both the living and the dead.

We remember Jesus, who will come at the end of time. None of us know what day that will be.

We hear his call to watch.

We light one Advent candle as a sign of our watchfulness and waiting.

One candle is lit. The chapel lights brighten.

Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest.

Through your Word and Spirit may our souls be blessed.

STAND

CONFESSION

We begin a new church year and season of Advent awaiting the arrival of our King. Today as we confess our sins, we ask our Lord to come in power to free us—not from worldly enemies—but from the dangers of our own sins.

Let us confess our sins to the Lord.

Holy God, gracious Father,

I am sinful by nature

and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions.

I have not loved you with my whole heart;

I have not loved others as I should.

I deserve your punishment both now and forever.

But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins

with his innocent suffering and death.

Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Yes, our King Jesus has come and has won the victory over our sins for us. He paid for our sins by his innocent suffering and death. As a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Now Jesus lives and rules over us by his divine peace until the day of his return. When he arrives, he will take us to be with him in the joys of the new heavens and the new earth.

"Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD,

to the house of the God of Jacob.

Then he will instruct us about his ways,

and we will walk in his paths."

For from Zion the law* will go out,

and the LORD's word will go out from Jerusalem.

⁴He will judge between the nations,

and he will mediate for many peoples.



GOSPEL Matthew 21:1–11

Others were cutting branches from the trees and spreading them out on the road. ⁹The crowds who went in front of him and those who followed kept shouting,

Hosanna[‡] to the Son of David!

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!§

Hosanna in the highest!

¹⁰When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, asking, "Who is this?" ¹¹And the crowds were saying, "This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee."



Show us the power he extends in his Word and sacraments to make us your children and keep us in faith. Thrill us with his promise to come and take us to our eternal home to live with you forever.

Open our eyes to see and believe the wonders of the Savior's love.

Protect us from the distractions that come at this time of the year. Even in gift-giving and celebrating, keep our hearts focused on Christ and his forgiving love.

Give us joy at his coming at Christmas, his coming in the gospel, and his coming again.

Move us to share with others the most important gift of this season, the truth about Jesus. Even in busy times lead us to pray for those whose joy is diminished because of sickness, pain, or loss. [Especially bless...] Give us opportunities to provide help to those in need. **May others see the love of Christ in our words and actions.**

Hear us, Lord, as we pray in silence.

Come, Lord Jesus. Amen.


OFFERING

Jesus is King! For this reason he was born, and for this reason he came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to his voice.


