OUR WORSHIP SERIES: LIVE LIKE YOU'LL LIVE FOREVER

What if instead of "Live each day like it's your last." We went with: "Live like you'll live forever"? God made us with immortal souls. Even after physical death, the Bible teaches us that all people will be resurrected, either to eternal life or for everlasting condemnation (John 5:29). Through faith in Jesus, our Savior, who rose from death and has forgiven all our sins, we have the promise of resurrection to eternal life! Let that sink in. In Jesus, you are going to live forever. The gift of eternal life shapes how we live each day.

TODAY: WE CAN LIVE FREE FROM THE FEAR OF JUDGMENT

Have you experienced that uncomfortable feeling that others are watching you, trying to find something to criticize? We don't want others judging us. It is bad enough listening to the voice inside our own head, whispering that we aren't worthy. How do we overcome the fear of judgment? It begins by realizing that there is only one person whose opinion ultimately matters—the Judge. Everyone is going to live forever in one of two very different places. Where you spend eternity depends on a judgment that Jesus will render. This week we see why his judgment need not trigger any sort of anxiety. Judgment day is something we can joyfully anticipate. We can live free from the fear of judgment.

For this I deserve your punishment now and forever.


Forgive me, Father.

FIRST READING Daniel 12:1–3

Judgment Day is a day of deliverance for those who are in Christ.

¹Then at that time, Michael, the great prince who stands over your people, will arise. There will be a time of distress that has not happened from the first time that there was a nation until that time.

At that time your people will be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book. ²Many who are sleeping in the dusty ground will awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame, to everlasting contempt. ³Those who have insight will shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who bring many to righteousness will shine like the stars forever and ever.

SECOND READING Hebrews 9:24–28

We can live free of the fear of God's judgment because of the sacrifice our high priest made.

²⁴For Christ did not enter a handmade sanctuary, a representation of the true sanctuary. Instead, he entered into heaven itself, now to appear before God on our behalf. ²⁵And he did not enter to offer himself many times, as the high priest enters the Most Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own. ²⁶Otherwise he would have needed to suffer many times since the creation of the world. But now he has appeared once and for all, at the climax of the ages, in order to take away sin by the sacrifice of himself. ²⁷And, just as it is appointed for people to die only once and after this comes the judgment, ²⁸so also Christ was offered only once to take away the sins of many, and he will appear a second time—without sin—to bring salvation to those who are eagerly waiting for him.

CONFESSION OF FAITH Large Catechism on the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed

Now, if you are asked, "What do you believe in the Second Article about Jesus Christ?" answer briefly,

"I believe that Jesus Christ, God's true Son, has become my Lord."

"But what does it mean to become Lord?"

"It is this. He has redeemed me from sin, from the devil, from death, and from all evil."

Let this, then, be the sum of this article: the little word *Lord* means simply the same as *redeemer*.

It means the One who has brought us from Satan to God, from death to life, from sin to righteousness, and who preserves us in the same.

Lord Jesus Christ, we look for your appearing at the end of the ages and await your salvation. Give us your wisdom, that we may shine like the brightness of the heavens in this dark world, and that we may lead many others to righteousness.




