However, we do ourselves a disservice if we simply recall the historic details of Easter without thinking long and hard about Easter's significance. Jesus won! That means something! It is our privilege and pleasure to use the fifty days of Easter to discuss this fact: because he lives, not only is our eternity secure, but we have abundant resources to face the present.

TODAY'S THEME: DEATH HAS LOST ITS STING


Death can sting in many ways. It can cast a shadow over every joyful moment of life, guaranteeing that joy won't last. Death can separate loved ones. Death can instill fear of what comes next...a reckoning and judgment. Yes, death can sting in many ways.

Note that word *can.* **Because he lives**, **death has lost its sting** for those who put their faith in the living Lord. Jesus' resurrection is proof that his death paid for all our sin. There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ. Our Christian loved ones who have passed are not lost. We will see them again. Christ's resurrection means we will rise to a world of incomprehensible and unending joy. Death remains unnatural. But Christ has defeated death. So, while death may still cause tears, death does not cause dread. Because he lives, death has lost its sting.

438 Jesus Christ Is Risen Today


The congregation sings stanzas 1 and 4. The choir sings stanzas 2 and 3.

EASTER DIALOGUE

Christ is risen!

Men: In all things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.

Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil, or fade.

This inheritance is kept in heaven for us.

Jesus is the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in him will live, even though they die.

Women: And those who live by believing in him will never die.

I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth.

Men: I myself will see him with my own eyes—I, and not another.

Since you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God.

When Christ, who is our life, appears, we will appear with him in glory.

Why do you look for the living among the dead?

He is not here; he has risen!


This is the day the Lord has made.


The cantor sings stanza four. The congregation sings stanza 6.

GOSPEL Luke 24:1–12

The account of Christ's Resurrection victory.

¹On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women went to the tomb, carrying the spices they had prepared. ²They found that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb. ³When they went in, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men stood by them in dazzling clothing. ⁵The women were terrified and bowed down with their faces to the ground.

The men said to them, "Why are you looking for the living among the dead? ⁶He is not here, but has been raised! Remember how he told you while he was still in Galilee ⁷that the Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again?" ⁸Then they remembered his words.

⁹When they returned from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles. ¹¹Yet these words seemed to them like nonsense, and they did not believe them. ¹²But Peter got up and ran to the tomb. Bending over to look in, he saw only the strips of linen cloth. He went home, amazed at what had happened.





Risen Savior, feed our faith with the message of your resurrection. Come to us in your Word and the feast of your sacrament to sustain and strengthen us until we feast with you in eternal glory.

Lift up your hearts.


We lift them up to the Lord.


WORDS OF INSTITUTION

Amen.




DISTRIBUTION

Whenever we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.


